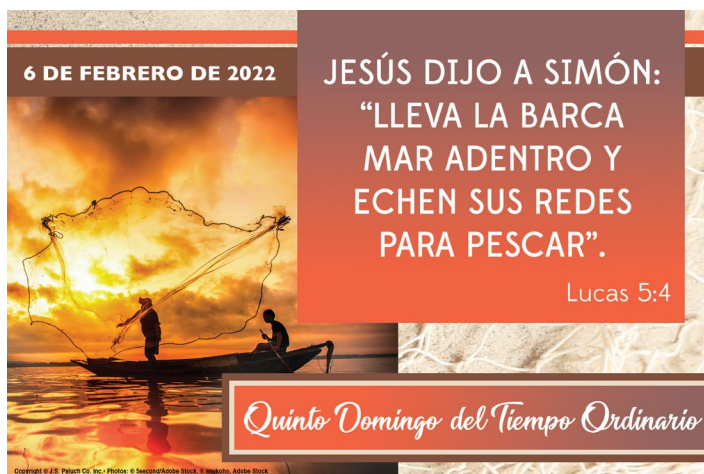

TEOFANÍAS

Las lecturas de hoy relatan tres teofanías, o manifestaciones de la presencia de Dios. El profeta Isaías se ve atrapado en una escena dramática de adoración celestial, con un trono real, brasas ardientes y serafines que cantan, "Santo, santo, santo". Isaías está sobrecogido. En el salmo responsorial, la asamblea añade su propia adoración a la de los serafines: "A la vista de los ángeles, cantaré tus alabanzas, Señor" (Salmo 138:1).

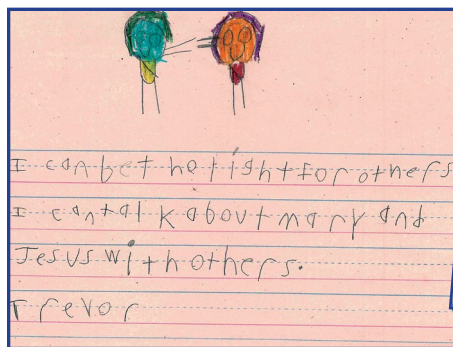
Pablo recuerda a los corintios su propia experiencia de una aparición del Señor después de la resurrección, lo que lo hace un apóstol, pero "nacido de forma poco común" (1 corintios 15:8), ya que no conoció a Jesús de carne y hueso. Los primeros que sí conocieron a Jesús de carne y hueso se sorprendieron por los consejos de cómo pescar que les dio el maestro que había solicitado subir a la barca de Simón, y como consecuencia obtuvieron una pesca extraordinaria. Aunque menos pintoresca que la de Isaías o Pablo, esta teofanía fue igual de extraordinaria.

THEOPHANIES

Today's readings recount three theophanies, or particular manifestations of God's presence. The prophet Isaiah is caught up in a dramatic scene of heavenly worship, with a royal throne, burning embers, and seraphim singing, "Holy, holy, holy." Isaiah is overwhelmed. In the responsorial psalm, the assembly adds its own worship to that of the seraphim: "In the sight of the angels, I will sing your praises, Lord" (Psalm 138:1).

Paul reminds the Corinthians of his own experience of a post-Resurrection appearance of the Lord, making him an apostle, but one "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), since he had no acquaintance with the earthly Jesus. The first of those who did know the earthly Jesus were surprised by fishing advice from the teacher who had commandeered Simon's boat, resulting in an extraordinary catch. Although less colorful than those of Isaiah or Paul, this theophany was just as overwhelming.

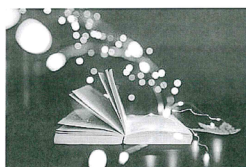


Be the light

There are many different meanings to "being the light." As a Catholic, I believe that being the light is understanding God and faith in a religious manner. There are various options to shine your light upon other people. All these ways are mainly rooted in setting examples for other people. These methods can be expressing your faith, loving others without hesitation, and being generous and kind at every opportunity you receive.

Expressing your faith is one of the most important means of being the light. It is great to identify as Catholic and practice that religion, but to shine your light onto other people, you have to embrace it. As it says in the bible, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor does anyone light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven." This means that if you have the light, you cannot hide it, you have to let it shine. Your faith is not something that you should be ashamed of, but something you want to share with other people. It doesn't have to be something huge like donating tons of money to charity or going to retirement homes every weekend. Although these are incredible actions that will undeniably spread the light, it isn't demanded of you. It is understood that some people don't have the time or money to do these things so often, but even a little smile or holding the door for someone can spread more light and joy than you may think. Some simple options you can choose from for spreading light are giving someone a compliment when they walk by, picking up something for someone if they drop it, or

When young people transition from foster care to independent living, the FLITE Center is there to assist them. The FLITE Center is a central resource for young people in Broward County's dependency system, offering a single, convenient point of access to a broad range of services and support they need to become successful adults. The FLITE Center is a centralized facility for dependent youth to learn the skills needed for independent living. The topics of concentration include the importance of completion of education, budgeting and finance, job and vocational training, housing options, and other essential skills needed to live independently.

Items needed are ordinary household items the young people will need to set up home in an apartment.

New items like can openers, toasters, coffee makers, salt/pepper shakers, cooking utensils, potholders, laundry soap, bath towels, kitchen towels, full size sheets, measuring cups and spoons, pots and pans are all needed.

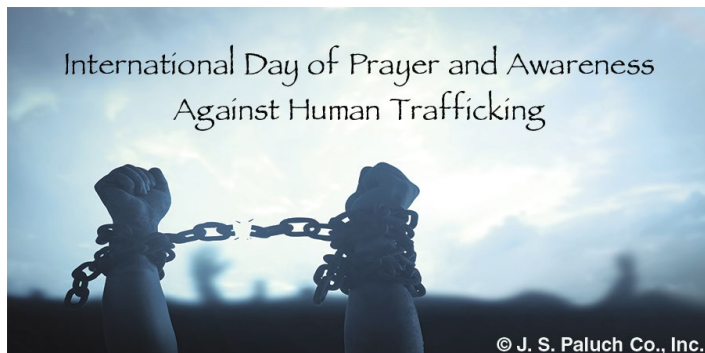

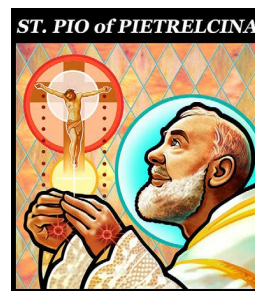
