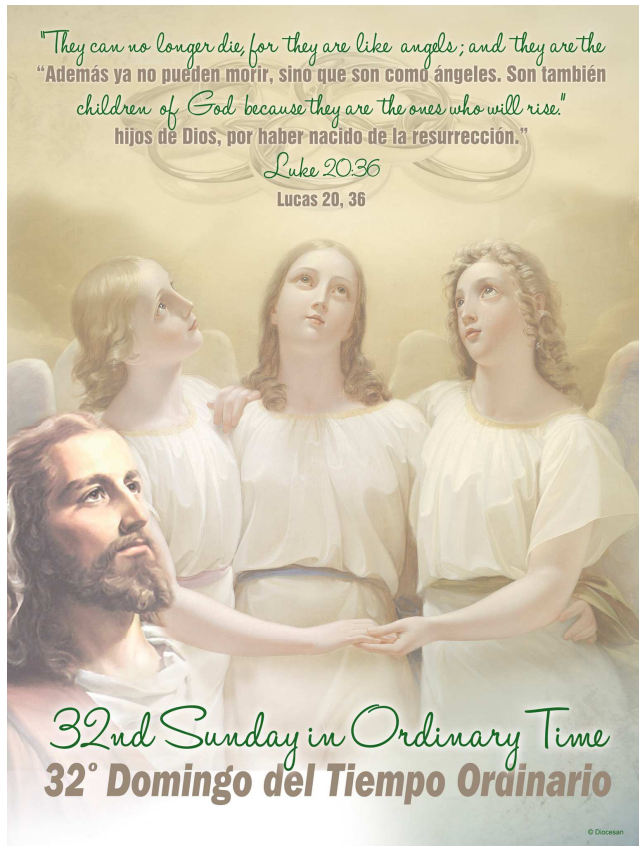

## Special Guest Writer... Mrs. Bryant, School Guidance Counselor . . .



St. Jerome Panthers say “No” to drugs, and “Yes” to leadership! When I proposed the idea of planning Red Ribbon Week to Student Council and National Junior Honor Society members early in October, they all rose to the occasion. It was amazing to see both groups come together in meetings and brainstorm different ideas for spirit days. We truly are one body here and it really shows when the students asked if they could speak to elementary students about peer pressure and not doing drugs. These leaders really wanted to serve! Every day the Student Council and NJHS members took turns leading the morning announcements with prayer and the pledge and a positive drug-free message. Each day had a different theme, such as “Team Up Against Drugs” and the students could wear a sports jersey or team shirts. Throughout the week there were other activities, such as a door decorating contest and signing a drug-free pledge. One of the highlights was the Fort Lauderdale Police showcase on the field. We had a parent and police officer, Officer Diaz with her therapy dog Officer Jill, along with horses, motorcycle units, and another police SUV. The officers

spoke to the students about what they did and how they serve and protect the community. “Officer McGruff” visited early childhood to remind students to keep their paws off drugs. While many students told me their favorite activity was seeing all the police, my personal favorite had to be when the Student Council and NJHS presented in the classrooms. There is something special about hearing from your peers, like listening to a big brother and big sister. The elementary students were engaged. In one class, Student Council secretary Yvens and NJHS member Max used the “4 Corners” game to demonstrate peer pressure, especially when they told a couple of students ahead of time to encourage people to get into their corners. In another class, Student Council president Novin, NJHS member Emily, and Luz, who is a part of both groups, utilized an inflatable die to get kids talking. Depending on the number the student rolled, it correlated to a different prompt, from healthy habits, dreams for the future, and why they would say no to drugs, etc. Our student leaders did a great job!

Red Ribbon Week was a huge success. These Panthers like to pray and play - and most importantly lead so they have no time for drugs!
